Consecration Sunday Is Coming February 19

10:00a.m. on Hilton Head; 11:00a.m. in Bluffton

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes. Our congregation's finance committee has selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?" During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's ministries. Every attendee and member who completes an Estimate of Giving Card does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card. We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship. We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and our church leadership. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.

Financial Update: "Hurricane Matthew, Be Gone!!"

In early December, I gave an update of the church finances at that time, noting the challenges we had endured as a result of Hurricane Matthew. The figures were indicating that at the then current trend, we may well end the year with a deficit of \$50,000 and we expected to see at least \$10,000 in hurricane expense not covered by insurance. An appeal was made for those who may have been disrupted in their giving to revisit their situation and give consideration to extend support to the church where they could. And for all to consider making gifts to return a part of the blessings we experienced in mostly being spared from the storm. The result was slightly short of a miracle. At the January Church Council meeting Jack Voden began the Treasurer's Report by saying, "I bring to you glad tidings of great joy!"

The Finance Committee is pleased to announce that the preliminary figures indicate the Operating Fund will end the year with a **SURPLUS of about \$30,000** as well as funds to cover our hurricane recovery. This result is a testament to the will and generosity of this congregation. Each of you enables all of us to be in service to the Lord in our individual ways.

This month, we "reboot" our Consecration Sunday stewardship campaign for 2017. As has been noted, we deferred Consecration Sunday to allow all to focus on the recovery effort from Matthew, both in our individual lives and as a community.

My hope is that the spirit of support we showed our church in the month of December will also be reflected as we complete our Consecration campaign. We have great missions and great visions for the upcoming year, which will require great commitments. Often times we don't bring faith along when it comes to finance. I, myself, have great faith in our abilities.

I would like to leave you with a story that occurred in our December miracle. On one of the checks we received, which was a gift above and beyond this individual's regular giving, the person wrote on the memo line: MATTHEW, BE GONE! (or something to that effect). It is that spirit and commitment which make this a great church. And remember, all that a church is – is a group of believers.




