## Rev. Julius Scott Affirmed as Pastor Emeritus at St. Andrew By-The-Sea



At the St. Andrew By-The-Sea Charge Conference held on Tuesday, October 9 at the church's Bluffton Campus, Sr. Pastor Neil M. Yongue Jr. brought a motion to the floor to elect the Rev. Julius S. Scott Jr. as Pastor Emeritus. Yongue noted the Rev. Scott's 23-years of service to St. Andrew as well as his national and international roles in the issues of social justice and education as he made the case for his nomination and election. UMC Walterboro District Superintendent Thomas Pearson Jr. presided over the meeting and called for the vote which was unanimous and met with a standing ovation. Among his many roles, Julius has been a chaplain, educator, served as president and interim president of several colleges, and was the executive director for higher education for the United

Methodist Church with primary responsibility for 128 schools and 623 campus ministries. He was a close personal friend of the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. and served as the executive director of the Martin Luther King Jr. Center for Nonviolent Social Change as well as being a founding member of the Hilton Head Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration Committee. He also helped to found Africa University. He has extensive involvement in many higher learning societies as well as on local boards and organizations. Julius and his wife Ann, who is a reception volunteer at the Hilton Head Campus, were surprised by the election and expressed humble gratitude to the Charge Conference. An installation ceremony will be held on November 4 at the Hilton Head Campus at 20 Pope Ave.
