Thank you, as always, to our generous St. Andrew and community supporters and volunteers.



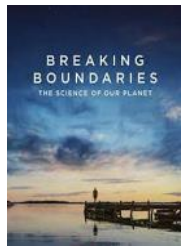
## Breaking Boundaries

Update

Church Council held its initial 2023 meeting on January 30. In an effort to expand our communications, highlights of the meetings will be shared by Sarah Coffin, Chair.

We ended the 2022 fiscal year nearly \$66,000 ahead of expenses after being negative late in the fourth quarter. We thank ALL who stepped up to close the gap! The 2023 budget was adopted and stands at \$1,007,750 with expenses and contributions balanced.

Much of the meeting was devoted to a report from our Strategic Planning Committee. Under Kerry Tilden's leadership and with great feedback from the Focus Groups, the team has developed a Purpose Statement and five goals. The goals were adopted at the meeting and will be developed further with specific strategies and objectives – stay tuned for an update soon.

Kim Likins and SPPRC will meet with our District Superintendent to share attributes important in the selection of our next Senior Pastor. In the past this has been well received by the Conference.

Julie Chalpan has developed a very comprehensive set of communications vehicles for internal and external messaging about St. Andrew, we want everyone to hear about us.

Rebecca Jones has formed an Outreach Team Council with leaders of all of our mission initiatives. We are expanding our efforts, partnering with local non-profits and making a difference.

Michael Tucker reported on all the Trustee work underway. The most exciting is the new lift that has been installed and will be usable very soon. We are renewing our focus on safety and security for our campus, members and guests...more to come on this.

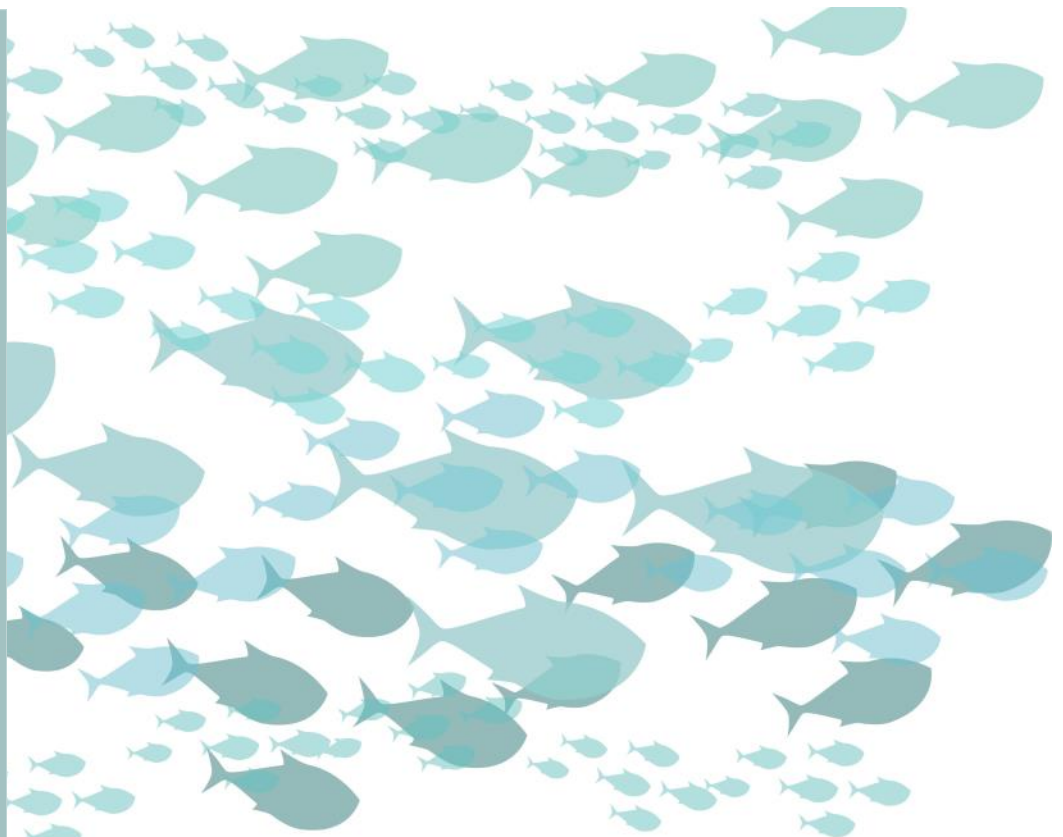
