Inspiring Worship by Rev. Jonathan Tompkins, Senior Pastor

One of the things I was pleased to find when I arrived here was our 5-Point Strategic Plan that had been completed by our leadership, based on feedback from the congregation, and that #1 is 'Inspiring Worship.'

The Inspiring Worship Committee formed from this and determined to 'make worship more inviting through an intentional creative process which will lead to modern musical arrangements, lay worship leaders, services at various times/days with different styles, etc.' and I feel I fit in well with this strategy!

Worship is #1 for me as well: I believe that what we do at church on a Sunday should form us to be the church for the rest of the week. I love to plan and lead worship; I love to be creative with worship; I love the vast array of styles and varieties of worship that our Christian tradition has gifted us over the past two millennia and will continue to in the years to come. I believe worship should inspire us to grow closer to God and to each other as we follow Jesus Christ together into the world.

My experience with worship here at St. Andrew so far has been wonderful. Combining the services into one for the summer was a great way to bring everyone together; it has brought energy and enthusiasm and fuller pews to the sanctuary; and it has allowed me to worship with my new church family in a unified manner.

The Inspiring Worship Committee has recommended that we keep the one, 10:00 am service schedule through the Fall, and I and our staff feel this is a good way to proceed temporarily for various reasons:

- The afore-mentioned energy and enthusiasm, fuller pews, and unified feeling, which helps lead to:
- A more hospitable and welcoming environment for firsttime guests who might feel more at-home and less conspicuous with more worshipers in attendance
- It is easier to find folks to serve in various roles, such as Acolytes, Ushers, Readers, Liturgists, Tech Team, Children's Church leaders, etc.
- A choir/musicians every Sunday, as opposed to having to rotate services each week
- Better stewardship of our monetary resources as the sanctuary lights, air, et al will be needed for a shorter time each week.

We will offer Sunday School Classes before the service at 9:00 am (or classes have the option to meet after the service if they would prefer). Following the worship service, we will continue

with our Lemonade in the Shade fellowship time (and need folks to help serve each week). We will also be introducing several new groups, studies, and special events for adults, youth, and children that will meet weekly or monthly to continue taking what we do on Sunday out into our week and into the world.

Let me assure you, this is only temporary. We plan to resume a two-service schedule in January. It is our hope that during the Fall, we will continue to grow worship attendance, and we will be able to intentionally plan for the other service to resemble what the Strategic Plan listed: worship that is a little different, a little more 'modern' in style, while keeping the same Scripture, sermon, and liturgy that our more traditional service offers as well. We will keep you updated throughout the Fall as to our progress, and would love for any of you with musical or creative abilities to let us know how you might want to be a part of worship, either style!

As I mentioned in a recent sermon, due to an injury, I've had to adapt my workouts. I've had to find new and different ways to move while maintaining some of my old workout routine, all so my injury can heal while my body can continue to stay healthy. We as the Church, the Body of Christ, are also called to adapt, to find new and different ways to be the Church while maintaining some of our 'old' routines as well, all so the Body of Christ can continue to heal and continue to stay healthy.

Has Anyone Seen Jesus In Me?

Earlier this summer, Rev. Frank shared an inspiring and challenging sermon entitled "Have You Seen Jesus My Lord?" Below are excerpts from that sermon:

"Often Jesus comes to us as a stranger. St. Francis of Assisi was abhorrently afraid of lepers. One day while riding his horse near the town of Assisi, Frances met a man afflicted with leprosy. Filled with horror and fear, surprisingly Francis dismounted his horse and kissed the leper. He also placed some coins in the leper's hand. After mounting his horse again, Frances looked around but did not see the leper anywhere. At that moment, he realized he had kissed Jesus. Jesus was the leper, the stranger in front of him.

Jesus said, "You will see me." But it's not enough to see Jesus in the people around us, in the stranger and those in need. The question we must answer as Jesus' disciples is, has anyone...the stranger, those in need, the persons we live beside and do business with...has anyone seen Jesus in me? It is one thing to see Jesus in others. It is another for someone to see Jesus in me." Stephen Ministry is one of many opportunities to let "the light of Christ shine through us, and by God's grace, others will see the light of Jesus in our imperfect selves."

St. Andrew Partners with Epworth Children's Home Foster Care Program to "Design on a Dime"

St. Andrew By-The-Sea is proud to have an Epworth Children's Home Foster Care program location on its property. As many know,

this building was formerly The Sandbox Children's Museum.

In May of this year, the office officially opened and is one of six Epworth Children's Home Foster Care program offices in South Carolina. Epworth's foster care program began in 2016. Olivia Hooker is the Foster Care Director and Pam Wilson is the Intake Coordinator for Epworth working from the Hilton Head Island location and serving Allendale, Beaufort, Colleton, Hampton, and Jasper counties.

Recently, Rebecca Jones, St. Andrew's Outreach Chair, and the committee met with the team at Epworth and has embarked on an inspiring project called "Design on a Dime." The group had its first meeting in late August and is open to more members who have an eye for design or a passion to shop for bargains. The goal is to design and furnish the Hilton Head Island office to promote a joyful, nurturing, and peaceful space to welcome children in the foster care system, as well as foster families, according to Connie Boswell-Smith, St. Andrew's point person for the project. Olivia and her team are excited to have help from St. Andrew members to brighten up the place and give it a needed facelift!

According to Olivia, there are over 40 children in foster care in Beaufort County, with an additional 26 children who need homes. The office is working on recruiting foster parents so that every child has a foster home. "Our goal is to license at least 20 families to be foster parents in the coming year in the Hilton Head Island area," said Olivia. "In the five counties we serve, there are 113 children who need foster care now, so the need is great."

In the state of South Carolina there are more than 4,000 children in foster care, with over 1,900 more homes needed to foster kids, according to the Epworth website.

August Project Updates

A drop ceiling has been installed in the Celebration Center foyer. A couple punch

list items remain to be completed.

A replacement for the 20+ year old water heater in the Celebration Center has been installed.

The County is continuing to pursue zoning changes for the property on Buckwalter. They are working with a consultant to expedite the process. Our lawyer has sent a purchase agreement to the county for the Buckwalter property. We are still looking at a First quarter 2024 settlement date.

A small group met with several sign companies to discuss a new sign for the front of the church along Pope Avenue and building signs for the campus. Work is continuing while we pursue funding for this project.

The air conditioning system for the left side of the Sanctuary will be replaced and is on order. Installation is expected in late September. We continue to cool the sanctuary with the one and a half systems working currently.



these free food items allow families to direct their income to housing and transportation expenses.

The July 17 Church Council meeting included both a Charge Conference and regular Church Council meeting. Our District Superintendent

gave Pastor Frank responsibility for conducting a Charge Conference to vote on modifications to Pastor Jonathan's compensation to enable him to prove Beaufort County residency. The motion was approved unanimously and there were no changes to the total compensation.

The five strategic planning teams are meeting and striving for some early wins and the completion of their plans by mid-fall. Under Michael Tucker's lead, a first draft of a Safety and Security manual has been completed. The Council decided that Fall Festival is a challenge for 2023 but some fundraiser will be planned for 2024. It's always a great opportunity for fellowship and camaraderie in addition to raising funds for missions. The Communications Committee is very active and beginning work on a new website and logo.

We continued the discussion on our position regarding human sexuality and reviewed a very rough belief statement. The conversation was open, candid and respectful. Many different beliefs and perspectives regarding this complex subject were shared. Pastor Jonathan reminded us once again of John Wesley's statement: "Though we many not think alike, may we still love alike." We will continue this journey.


