We are presented opportunities each day to be used by God, to be the hands and feet of Christ in the lives of others, to be the answer to their prayers. This is part of God's plan and God's will for each of us. When we invite God to lead, guide, and use us, we are inviting Him to help us pay attention, to look for and see these opportunities, and ultimately to say yes in those moments when our life could be a part of God's larger redemption story. Often, the call is to be a Christian friend, to simply be *present* with someone and *listen* to their story.

#### From the Chair

Many thanks to Lois Chandler, Paula Refice, Connie Borgianini, Lorena Best, Kerry Tilden, Lesley Kyle, and all the others who helped set up for the wonderful Welcome Back Lunch and Opportunity Fair on September 10. The attendance was great and over 50 opportunities for classes, fellowship, outreach, music, worship, and Bible studies were presented. If you weren't there you missed some great fried chicken, corn dogs and ice cream sandwiches!

Church Council leadership is busy on many fronts: a small team is working on refreshing our website, SPPRC is beginning the search for a Family Ministry position, podcasts of our services are now available, and a purchase agreement between St. Andrew and Beaufort County has been signed regarding the sale of the Buckwalter property.

In the coming months we will be reviewing the 2024 budget, continuing our discussion regarding the Way Forward, reviewing the work of the five strategic planning groups and developing further plans to safely secure our church.



#### **Trustee Tidbits**

- ♦ The county continues to pursue zoning changes for the property on Buckwalter. They are working with a consultant to expedite the process. All sides are excited to see this happen. We are still looking at a first quarter 2024 settlement date.
- The air conditioning system for the left side of the Sanctuary is in the final stages of manufacturing and will arrive next week. Installation is expected in late September or early October and will take a week to complete.
- All the fire system inspections have been completed. We are in the process of finalizing some punch list items to complete the inspection requirements.
- We are in the final stages of finalizing the Multi-Peril Insurance for the church. It has been difficult to find an underwriter but we feel we have found an excellent insurer although the premium has gone up substantially including an increase in named storm deductible.
- ♦ A long-range equipment maintenance and replacement plan is being finalized. It includes all assets greater than \$2,500 and shows potential capital outlays for the next 20 years.


