



Bruce lives in Sun City and enjoys music, gardening, travel, and volunteering in his spare time.






It's not within our own power to make a fresh start. What we need is a God who refuses to be trapped in eternity, a God

Servanthood

This summer, Bruce Gale, our Minister of Music, introduced us to a wonderful song that was, until then, unfamiliar to me: *The Servant Song*, by Richard Gillard. It perfectly describes the true meaning of "servanthood." The first verse reads as follows:

Will you let me be your servant, Let me be as Christ to you; Pray that I may have the grace to Let you be my servant, too.

What a beautiful, prayerful thought. At first glance, the message is exactly what we would expect because it echoes and summarizes in a few words the main theme of Jesus's ministry...we are to love and care for each other. But, take a closer look, especially at the second phrase: "Pray that I may have the grace to let you be my servant, too." Wait! What? That seems backwards; is that saying that I should let someone be a servant to me? If so, it implies that there is another side to Servanthood: serving others with Christ-like love on the one side, and accepting the offer of care with reciprocating love and grace on the other.

Thinking about that, we are led to understand that when we are struggling, it's OK (good even) to ask for help; not only is the care receiver comforted through Christian care, but the struggling individual also blesses the care giver by graciously accepting his or her care. Both parties in the relationship become answers to each other's prayer.

The second verse of *The Servant Song* explains why we should offer and accept care to/from one another: We are pilgrims on a journey,

We are trav'lers on the road; We are here to help each other Walk the mile and bear the load.

In Adam Hamilton's insightful book *Why*, he explains that God answers many prayers for relief to struggles by sending people to be with us and provide Christian care in response to those prayers. Caring people who answer God's call become the hands and feet of Jesus, loving and comforting us when we suffer...helping to bear our load. If we embrace this truth that God sends people to those in crisis, we are then led to understand that when we ignore the quiet urge to help someone or reject the offer of compassionate care, we may be missing out on God's answer to our prayers.

Returning to *The Servant Song*, the remaining three verses beautifully express the nature of the relationship between the care giver and care receiver:
