Repentance: Becoming Who You Are by Rev. Frank Lybrand, Associate Pastor

I am writing this the day after Ash Wednesday. Yesterday, Pastor Jonathan and I greeted Ash Wednesday observers in the sanctuary and parking lot with ashes for their foreheads, a symbol of repentance. We spoke the words that are inseparable from the Lenten season, "Repent and believe the gospel."

Repentance is often thought of in negative terms. It conjures up feelings of guilt because of the things we have done we know we shouldn't have done and things we did not do, even though we knew we should. Repentance can be and often is an act of self-flagellation. We may not beat ourselves bloody physically, but we inflict a worse punishment on ourselves. We flog our inner selves until we bleed unstoppable.

There may be a healthier and more life-giving meaning to repentance. The experience of true repentance points us to a part of ourselves we have hidden within us, which we have not discovered yet know is there. True repentance tells me there's a better person in me wanting, longing to come alive. So the invitation to repent is an invitation to become my true self, to lay aside the false me I have pretended to be, and let the image of God within be revealed.

As Christians, we believe our true self has been revealed in

Jesus. He is who we long to be. So, through this season of Lent, may we be blessed with true repentance as we become who we are. ~ Lenten Blessings, Frank

As part of a recent trip to Ecuador/Galapagos Islands, I partnered

with St. Andrew global missionary Sara Flores, to conduct a Days for Girls workshop that teaches young women about reproductive health, hygiene, self defense. Each girl was also given a menstruation kit that includes underwear, reusable pads, liners, washcloth and soap. The kits are reusable and should last at least 4 years if cared for properly. The 100 kits that were donated to the young

ladies in Ecuador were made in Ecuador by a Days for Girls Social Enterprise.

To share the impact, at the end of the workshop, the young female minister who oversees the afterschool program, was almost in tears expressing her gratitude since many of the girls in the pro-

gram currently use old rags as pads. She could already see the change in their demeanor with their new kits!

My husband, Mike and I sponsored the kits for this trip, however, going forward it would be great to have the resources to sponsor additional kits in Ecuador and beyond. This is where you come in with our Coins for Lent global missions project.

The Colgate University Chorus from Hamilton, NY will present a concert at St. Andrew on





In the February Fisherman article I shared that the Church Council leadership team would undertake a discussion regarding the current challenges facing the United



Methodist Church. We spent several hours along with Pastors Jonathan and Frank on Saturday, February 17 to begin discussing "The Way Forward" as it relates to St. Andrew, and review the schism that has caused one fourth of UMC congregations to disaffiliate.

Jonathan shared a brief historical background that has led to our current denominational situation, the process that some churches are going through in order to leave the UMC, the cost to do so, and a perspective on the upcoming General Conference April 23 - May 3. He reminded us that the UMC has been disagreeing on The Way Forward since 1972; he also reiterated the current theological approach to interpreting scripture as we have explored in

our recent sermon series on the Bible.

We watched Adam Hamilton's video "Why We are Staying in the <u>UMC</u>" and discussed our reactions to this presentation in small groups. We also discussed a video from Myers Park UMC in Charlotte regarding "What's Happening in United Methodism." Both videos brought historical context, reflections on how our world-wide denomination has come to this point, and updates on the legislative topics to be discussed at General Conference.

Everyone felt they gained new insights and concluded that hosting a listening and sharing opportunity for members of St. Andrew would be helpful in communicating our collective viewpoints. Communication with more insight will be sent to each member inviting them to a church-wide informational session on Monday, April 8.


