Pray This Way: Learning and Living the Lord's Prayer

'Forgive as We Forgive'

Scripture: Matthew 6:14-15 (Common English)

"If you forgive others their sins, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you don't forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your sins.

Matthew 18:21-22 (Common English)

Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, how many times should I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Should I forgive as many as seven times?"

Jesus said, "Not just seven times, but rather as many as seventy-seven times."

In the Word was life,

and the life was the light for all people. Amen.

Navigational Markers (thoughts and ideas to guide you)

Depth Finder (questions to go deeper) - *Bending our lives toward God this week*

Did you grow up praying the Lord's Prayer using 'trespasses,' 'debts,' or 'sins'? What does each of those words mean for you when praying to God to forgive us of them?

Think more about Jesus on the cross saying 'Father, forgive them...' How does this exemplify the love of God towards you?

'Forgiveness is not easy, normal, weakness, forgetting...but it is freeing' Have you seen or experienced forgiveness that is freeing?

Prayer as We Put Out to Sea

Crux Prayer: Imagine the cross shown in the sermon, with 'Forgiven' written vertically and 'Forgive' written horizontally. Engage in breath prayer.

For example:

(Breathe in): *Father, forgive...*(breathe out) *so I can forgive...*

(Breathe in) *Thank you for forgiveness...*(breathe out) *help me forgive...*
